#### New Athletic Participation Fee

In an effort to offset the tremendous shortfall in school funding in Michigan, Schoolcraft Schools is initiating an athletic participation fee for all student athletes who plan on participating in high school or middle school sports next year. The fee is \$50 per year per athlete and covers all of the sports that the student-athlete chooses to participate in. There is a maximum fee of \$150 per family per year. Families are encouraged to pay the athletic participation fee when they get their athletic physicals on Monday, June 7. Athletic fee forms are available in the high school and middle school offices. Forms are also available on the Schoolcraft Schools website under athletic forms. No student-athlete will be able to participate in any contest in 2010-2011 without a current physical and a paid participation fee. **"TALES TO TAILS"--- a NEW PROGRAM**---The Schoolcraft Community Library will be starting a new program for the summer called "Tales to Tails". It is a program for children ages 6 and up to sign up to read for 20 minutes to a 'therapy dog' in a non-threatening and non-judgmental environment. The program will run for one evening and one morning from mid-June through mid-August. The first offering will begin on Wednesday June 23 from 6-7:30 p.m. and run each Wednesday evening through August 11. The second offering will be Thursday mornings, beginning June 24 from 10:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and run each Thursday morning through August 12. There are 4 twenty minute time slots available and each child will read to the dog and his/her owner. Nancy Dage of Schoolcraft, and Beth Schroeder of Portage will be the two owners and Dugan and Harvey are two of the dogs that children could be reading too. The beautiful Victorian house that Amy Masterson decides to rent, fully furnished, is more than just a place to start over with her young daughter. When Amy learns that the three-story house on Sugar Plum Lane belonged to her great-grandmother, Eleanor Rucker, who Amy's mother had been searching for until her recent death, she hopes she can find a window into the past her mother never found.

As Amy settles into Fairbrook, she's stunned to learn that Ellie Rucker still lives on Sugar Plum Lane, cared for by Amy's neighbor, Maria. But Ellie's mind is failing rapidly, her memories fading with each passing day. She shows no hint of recognition when her great-granddaughter introduces herself, and Amy is heartbroken at the chance they've both missed. But it's never too late to hope---or to trust in bonds of love that, though they cannot be seen, can never be broken.
